When appropriate, one copy of each report will go to the local police, Residence Hall Dean, Campus Security, and to the student's file. Incidents of sex crimes should also be reported to the same authorities. If the complaint is found to be valid, disciplinary action will be taken. The deans will assist sexual assault victims in obtaining counseling services.

Reporting to the police is a personal choice. Filing a police report does not require prosecution.

TIPS FOR PERSONAL SAFETY

Be observant. Make sure you are aware of your environment. It is advisable that you familiarize yourself with campus buildings and landmarks.

After dark, walk in well-lit and populated areas of the campus and the surrounding area. Always remain on campus and city sidewalks. Avoid secluded, poorly-lit areas. Cutting between buildings and through alleys takes you out of the public eye, which is where you don't want to be.

Walk in groups. There is safety in numbers. If you are alone, call campus security to escort you to your residence hall.

Walk with purpose and attitude. Be assertive and display confidence.

Become "street smart." It is not an instinct. It is common sense. When you feel uneasy about a person or situation, be prepared to react, but try to avoid confrontations.

If you choose to resist an attacker, remember that your goal is to escape. Resist vigorously with the purpose of getting free. Then run to a public place. In attempted sexual assaults, approximately 50% of victims escape if they yell, and up to 85% escape if they physically resist quickly and vigorously. Be aware of vulnerable targets of the assailant; eyes, nose, throat, stomach, kneecaps, and groin.

Walk close to curbs, staying clear of doors and bushes.

Have your keys ready and accessible as you approach your car, office, house, or residence hall.

If you ever have the feeling you are being followed, walk in another direction to a public place.

If something seems strange, trust your instincts and call campus security or the police department to report suspicious people or situations.

TIPS FOR PROPERTY SAFETY

Never leave property unattended in any campus building or in your car. Theft is common on any campus. However, it can be avoided if you are constantly mindful of your property. If you need to step out, leave your property under the supervision of someone you trust, or take it with you.

Do not let your purse bounce loosely over your shoulder and of your hip as you walk. Carry it tucked under your arm, with any flaps facing your body.

TIPS FOR SAFETY IN YOUR RESIDENCE

Always lock your windows and doors when stepping away from your residence. Most burglars are in and out of the house in less than 3 minutes.

Don't leave spare keys hidden on your property. Most thieves know all the common places in which they are hidden.

Never tell a stranger or someone you do not trust where you live or that you are home alone.

Be aware of open windows when dressing or undressing.

TIPS FOR SAFETY IN YOUR VEHICLE

Always inspect your vehicle before entering. Check under the vehicle while approaching it. Also, check the back seat before entering.

Have your keys in your hand before reaching your car.

When parking at night, try to select a spot that is well-lit.

A cellular phone can be of great assistance in an emergency situation.
